PIZZA ROLL-UPS RECIPE

These bite-sized pizza treats are perfect for an after-school snack.

INGREDIENTS

- * I/2 pound ground beef
- * I can (8 ounces) tomato sauce
- * I/2 cup shredded mozzarella cheese
- * I/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- * 2 tubes (8 ounces each) refrigerated
- crescent rolls

DIRECTIONS

- * In a large skillet, cook beef over medium
- heat until no longer pink; drain. Remove
- from heat. Add tomato sauce, mozzarella
- cheese and oregano.
- * Separate crescent dough into eight rectangles, pinching seams together. Place about 3
- tablespoons of meat mixture along one long
- side of each rectangle. Roll up, jell roll style,
- starting with a long side. Cut each roll into
- three pieces.
- * Place, seam side down, 2 in. apart on
- greased baking sheets. Bake at 375° for 15

minutes or until golden brown.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL SAFETY REMINDERS

As summer winds down, kids across the country are heading back to school. Motorists need to use extra caution, especially before and after school. Here are a few quick reminders:

- Watch for children at intersections and in crosswalks.
- · Take extra care when entering or exiting driveways.
- Beware of children darting out from between parked cars.
- Be careful when following or approaching a school bus, especially near bus stops.
- Don't pass a school bus on the right and stop for any school bus that is stopped with its lights flashing while children are entering or exiting the bus.


Parents also need to take time to talk with their children about important safety rules. The National Safety Council offers these safety reminders:

- Children who walk to school should use sidewalks whenever possible. On streets with no sidewalks, walk on the side of the road, facing traffic.
- Children riding bicycles to school should always wear helmets. They should ride on the right side of the road, single file, following all rules to the road.
- · Children taking buses should get to their bus stops early and stand well back from the curb, especially when a bus is approaching.
- Bus riders should always walk in front of a bus, where the driver can see them.
- Stay seated on the bus until it has completed stopped.
