GRASSHOPPER PIE RECIPE

You will only need six ingredients to whip up this fluffy and refreshing grasshopper pie.

INGREDIENTS

- * 2 packages (3 oz. each) cream cheese, softened
- * I can (14 oz.) sweetened condensed milk
- * 15 drops green food coloring
- * 24 chocolate-covered mint cookies, divided
- * 2 cups whipped topping
- * I chocolate crumb crust (8 inches)

DIRECTIONS

* In a large bowl, beat the cream cheese until fluffy. Gradually beat in milk until smooth. Beat in the food coloring. Coarsely crush 16 mint cookies; stir into the cream cheese mixture. Fold in whipped topping. Spoon into the crust. Cover and freeze overnight. Remove from the freezer 15 minutes before serving. Garnish with remaining cookies.
