# PEANUT BUTTER 'N' JELLY BARS RECIPE

Easy preparation makes this one scrumptious dessert....even at the last minute. You might want to vary the jam/jelly to suit your own family's tastes.

#### INGREDIENTS

- \* I tube (16-1/2 ounces) refrigerated peanut
  butter cookie dough
- \* I/2 cup peanut butter chips
- \* I can (16 ounces) buttercream frosting
- \* I/4 cup creamy peanut butter
- \* 1/4 cup seedless raspberry jam or grape jelly

#### DIRECTIONS

- \* Let dough stand at room temperature for
   5-10 minutes to soften. Press into an
- ungreased 13-in.  $\times$  9-in. baking dish; sprinkle
- with peanut butter chips.
- \* Bake at 375° for 15-18 minutes or until lightly browned and edges are firm to the touch. Cool on wire rack.
- \* In a small bowl, beat frosting and peanut butter until smooth. Spread over bars. Drop jam by teaspoonful over frosting; cut through frosting with a knife to swirl the jam.
