RENT PAYMENT OPTIONS FOR CCHA RESIDENTS

The Carroll County Housing Authority is working with GovCard System to provide various options to our residents to pay their rent without having to write out a check or to purchase a money order. The new system has been instituted in various

city, county and other government and non-profit institutions to provide a safe and secure method of making payments.

The GovCard System will allow residents to pay their rent using their own debit or credit card or have their rent taken out of their personal checking/savings account. These methods of payments will be able to be made on the housing authorities website by clicking the "pay now" tab, with a mobile app on your cell phone, using your computer, calling a specific telephone number to make the payment or paying your rent at the housing authority office by swiping your debit/credit card on the housing office's new credit card terminal. You will also have the option of setting up the recurring payments on specific dates so that your rent or other recurring monthly payments will never be late again!

The GovCard System will charge a minimum fee for any of the transactions described in this article. The charges will automatically be withdrawn from your account when you make the requested transaction. The Carroll County Housing Authority is working with GovCard System so that the fees are reasonable.

While much needs to be accomplished before this exciting payment option is available to our residents, we will be sending out a survey next week to all our residents so we can see if you are interested in this payment option. If we have enough interest by our residents in this payment option software system, then we will work closely with GovCard to provide this unique opportunity to our residents. We anticipate that this payment option will not be operational until November 1, 2019. Please watch for the survey and return the completed survey to the housing office as soon as possible. Without your feedback on this new product we cannot move forward in providing better service and efficiency for our residents.



CREAM CHEESE SWIRL BROWNIES

A Father's Day dessert that is way better than a tie!

INGREDIENTS

- * 3 large eggs, divided use
- * 6 tablespoons butter, softened
- * I cup sugar, divided
- * 3 teaspoons vanilla extract
- * I/2 cup all-purpose flour
- * 1/4 cup baking cocoa
- * I pkg (8 oz.) reduced-fat cream cheese

DIRECTIONS

* Pre-heat oven to 350°. Separate two eggs, putting each white in a separate bowl; set aside. In a small bowl, beat butter and 3/4 cup sugar until crumbly. Beat in the whole egg, one egg white and vanilla until well combined. Combine flour and cocoa; gradually add to egg mixture until blended.

CREAM CHEESE BROWNIES CONT'D

Pour into 9-in greased baking pan; set aside. * In a small bowl, beat cream cheese and remaining sugar until smooth. Beat in the second egg white. Drop by rounded tablespoonfuls over the batter; cut through the batter with a knife to swirl.

* Bake 25-30 minutes or until set and edges pull away from sides of pan. Cool on a wire rack.

TRI-COUNTY OPPORTUNITIES COUNCIL

CSBG....COMMUNITY SERVIES BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

The Community Services Block Grant provides Community Action Agencies like TRI-COUNTY OPPORTUNITIES COUNCIL funds to reduce poverty, revitalize low-income communities, and to empower low-income families to become self-sufficient. The following are a few **NEW PROGRAMS** that will be available this summer:



- 1. Adult Literacy Program provides eligible customers the opportunity to gain the required skills to complete Adult Basic Education, GED, or English as a second language.
- 2. Transportation Assistance Program provides financial assistance for transportation needs to maintain employment or attend an accredited Illinois post-secondary institution.
- 3. Dental Assistance Program provides assistance to customers seeking dental assistance to meet their dental needs.
- **ID Program** provides assistance to customers seeking the necessary identification documents in order to improve a level of self-sufficiency.
- **School Supply Program** provides assistance to purchase school supplies for children to attend school; kindergarten through 12th grade.
- Senior Meal Program provides financial assistance and education to eligible seniors, over the age of 65, with a grocery voucher or Meals on Wheels service in order to meet meal gaps.
- 7. Little Bottoms Program provides financial assistance to eligible families to offset the costs of hygiene assistance for children under the age of 4.
- 8. Personal Care Program provides assistance to eligible families to help with the costs of personal hygiene and cleaning supplies to help maintain a healthy lifestyle.
