VALENTINE'S RECIPE CHOCOLATE-COVERED STRAWBERRY COBBLER

Top this delicious dessert with
 whipped cream, either plain or with a little
 chocolates syrup stirred in.

INGREDIENTS

- lacktriangle st I cup butter, cubed
- * I-1/2 cups self-rising flour
- * 2-1/4 cups sugar, divided
- * 3/4 cup 2% milk
- * I teaspoon vanilla extract
- * I/3 cup baking cocoa
- * 4 cups fresh strawberries, quartered
- * 2 cups boiling water
- * Whipped cream and additional strawberries

DIRECTIONS

- * Preheat oven to 350°. Place butter in a
 13x9-in. baking pan; heat pan in oven 3-5
 minutes or until butter is melted. Meanwhile, in a large bowl, combine flour, I-I/4
 cups sugar, milk and vanilla until it is well
 blended. In a small bowl, mix cocoa and
 remaining sugar.
- * Remove baking pan from oven; add the
 batter. Sprinkle with strawberries and
 cocoa mixture; pour the boiling water
 evenly over top (do not stir.)

SEVEN FUN FACTS ABOUT GROUNDHOGS

According to legend, groundhogs can predict the beginning of Spring. On February 2nd, Groundhog Day, a famous groundhog named Punxsutawney Phil will wake up and come out of his den. If he sees his shadow, he will go back into his den for 6 more weeks. This will leave us with 6 more weeks of winter. If he does not see his shadow, spring will come early! In celebration of Groundhog Day, here are a few fun facts about groundhogs:



- I. Groundhogs are excellent swimmers and tree climbers
- 2. The names groundhog and woodchuck both refer to the same animal
- 3. Because of harsher winter climate, groundhogs in Quebec, Canada will hibernate for about 167 days whereas groundhogs in Pennsylvania will hibernate for about 114 days
- 4. During hibernation, a groundhog's heart rate will drop from 80 bpm to 4 bpm
- 5. Groundhogs typically live between three to six years in the wild
- 6. Females will give birth to four to six cubs in the early Spring, and the young will remain with the mother for several months
- 7. Groundhogs can grow to 13 pounds and are the largest member of the squirrel family
