Lemon pie filling lends a splash of citrus flavor to a convenient

cake mix, and a rich cream cheese frosting
 gives it sweetness.

INGREDIENTS

- * I package lemon cake mix (regular size)
- * 4 large eggs, room temperature
- * I can (15-3/4 ounces) lemon pie filling
- * 3 ounces cream cheese, softened
- * I/2 cup butter, softened
- * 2 cups confectioners' sugar
- * I-I/2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- * I to 2 tablespoons 2% milk
- * Colored sugar, optional

DIRECTIONS

- * In a large bowl, beat the cake mix and eggs until well blended. Fold in pie filling.
- * Spread into a greased 15x10x1-in baking pan. Bake at 350° until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean, 18-20 minutes. Cool on a wire rack.
- * In a small bowl, beat the cream cheese,
 butter, and confectioners' sugar until
 smooth. Stir in vanilla and enough milk to
 reach desired consistency. Spread over
 cake. If desired, sprinkle with colored
 sugar. Store in the refrigerator.

CARROLL COUNTY TRANSIT...

....is offering transportation for anyone of any age to receive a COVID-19 vaccination and/or for a COVID-19 test prior to surgical procedures **ONLY**. If you have any COVID-19 symptoms or have been exposed to COVID-19 transit will not be able to provide service to you.

CCT now has four (4) buses and ten(10) vans, all wheel chair accessible, and are available to take people to meals, medical appointments and to do shopping and other errands around the county or to Freeport, Sterling, or Clinton, IA. They have now added medical appointments to Rockford, and Monroe, WI, with a 3-day notice. If you need a ride call at least 48 hours in advance to schedule your trip. For shopping trips there is a 5-bag limit due to space issues. They provide this service to assist those who no longer drive or would rather have someone else do the driving.

Carroll County Transit is an on-demand response, door-to-door public transportation service administered by Carroll County. CCT provides rides to persons of all ages.

HOURS OF OPERATION

Transportation is available Monday through Friday, 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. with the exception of observed holidays. In case of inclement weather, Carroll County Transit will not transport to ensure the safety of riders as well as drivers.

Cost

Transportation fares vary.
