ALL-AMERICAN SHEET CAKE RECIPE

This sweet and tangy sheet cake piled with fresh whipped cream and juicy

fruit is so good, you might just want to eat it for breakfast.

INGREDIENTS

- * I package white cake mix (regular size)
- * I cup buttermilk
- * 1/3 cup canola oil
- * 3 large eggs, room temperature
- * 2 to 3 cups sweetened whipped cream
- * 3 to 4 cups assorted fresh fruit

DIRECTIONS

- * Preheat oven to 350°. Combine cake mix, buttermilk, oil and eggs; beat on low • speed for 30 seconds. Beat on medium for 2 minutes.
- * Pour into a 13x9-in. baking pan coated with cooking spray. Bake until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean,
- 25-30 minutes. Cool completely on a wire rack.
- * Spread whipped cream over cake, top with assorted fresh fruit. Refrigerate. YIELD: 15 servings.
