PEANUT BUTTER BLOSSOM COOKIE RECIPE

INGREDIENTS

- * I/2 cup butter, softened
- * I/2 cup creamy peanut butter
- * I/2 cup sugar
- * I/2 cup packed brown sugar
- * I large egg, room temperature
- * I-I/4 cups all-purpose flour
- * 3/4 teaspoon baking soda
- * 1/2 teaspoon baking powder
- * 1/4 teaspoon salt
- * 36 milk chocolate kisses

DIRECTIONS

- * Pre-heat oven to 350°. Cream butter, peanut butter and sugars until light and fluffy, 5-7 minutes. Beat in egg. In another bowl, sift together flour, baking soda, baking powder and salt; beat into peanut butter mixture.
- * Drop by level tablespoonfuls 2 in. apart
 onto ungreased baking sheets. Bake until
 light brown, 10-12 minutes. Remove from
 oven; immediately push a chocolate kiss into
 the top of each cookie. Cool on pans 2
 minutes; remove from pans to wire racks to
 cool completely. YIELD: 3 dozen.


